The High Court

1. The High Court is the head of the Judiciary in the State.

2. Every Judge of a High Court is appointed by the President.

3. In making appointment as a High Court Judge, President can consult the Chief Justice of India, the Governor of the State and also the Chief Justice of that High Court.

4. A Judge of the High Court can hold office until the age of 62 years.

5. A High Court Judge can leave his office : ? By resignation in writing dressed o the President. ? By being appointed a Judge of the Supreme Cou o eing nsf red to any other High Court by the President. ? By removal by the Pre ident. The mode of removal of a Judge of the High Court is same as that of a J dg f the Sup me Court.

6. The qualifications for being a Judge of the High Cou are ? Be citizen of India. ? Not above 62 years of age. ? Must have held for at 1 st 10 y ars a judicial office in territory of India or experience of at least 10 ye s as ad cate f a High Court, or of two or more such courts in succession in India.

7. Salaries and allowances of the High Court Jud s e charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State [Art. 202(3) (d)].

8. After retirement a perm nent Judg of Hig Court can not plead or act in a Court or before any authority in India, cept the S preme Court and a High Court in which he has not worked.
